SERVICEOFFICER REPORT:

Florida now has a secure website to provide emergency information in case of an accident.

Go to: <https://www6.hsmv.state.fl.us/dlcheck/findcustomer>

This emergency information website was developed for quick notification in cases of accidents or medical emergencies. . If you use this site be sure to keep it updated so you do not end up slowing down the response time. You may enter two (2) emergency contacts on your Florida Driver License (electronically) which can only be retrieved by a police officer. It is very easy to inter the information. All you need is your emergency contact Name, address, and phone number. It takes less than five minutes to complete.

Note: This can also be accomplished at your local DMV office if you do not have a computer. OK, OK, if you want me to help you fill out the information just see me in the office Monday, Wednesday, or Friday 3:00PM - 5:00PM

Can you stop a debt collector from contacting you?

If a collector goes to your home or calls you on the phone and you want to stop them from returning, ask who they work for and what debt they are collecting for. Tell the collector you are writing a letter to stop the collection and to please give you the appropriate address to send the letter.



You can stop a debt collector from contacting you by writing a letter to the collector telling them to stop. Once the collector receives your letter, they may not contact you again except to say there will be no further contact or to notify you that the debt collector or the creditor intends to take some specific action. Please note, however, that sending such a letter to a collector does not make the debt go away if you actually owe it. You could still be sued by the debt collector or your original creditor. But, writing the letter will give you time to research the validity of the debt and possibly work out a compromise with the creditor if you actually owe the debt.

Where can you report a debt collector for an alleged violation?

Report any problems you have with a debt collector to your state Attorney General' s office and the Federal Trade Commission. Many states have their own debt collection laws, and your Attorney General' s office can help you determine your rights.

EMPLOYMENT OFFICER:

Networking is Name of Game at Job Fairs

What is a job fair? That's when employers gather their printed pens and candy dishes and head out to hotel ballrooms and school gyms.

If you've attended a job fair, you know what to expect. There will be a registration table to include your name for drawings or to drop off your resume to be copied to all attending employers. There might be speakers offering advice. And there will be a roomful of employers, standing their folding tables, with information and applications to hand out.

But what there might not be are jobs. When the economy is uncertain, the prospect of job openings at these gatherings is equally uncertain. So, why do employers attend? For the same reason you should: to meet people... to NETWORK.

To get you in the right frame of mind, here is a short list of do's for your next job fair.

DO ...

Bring lots of resumes, on good stationery. Consider printing some business cards as well. Include your name, contact information and the type of work you are seeking.

Plan to stay a while. If you can spare a couple of hours at least, you will force yourself into being more thorough with each interaction. Just cruising past tables to drop off resumes is a bad strategy because it doesn't take advantage of the opportunity to meet people.

Listen more than you speak. This is the opportunity to learn about companies and make inside contacts.

Gather business cards or other contact information from each table.

Plan to follow up with key companies within the next few days with a letter or phone call. Your goal is to set a meeting where you can speak with someone without the distractions of the job fair.

Ask good questions. Not just which jobs are open, but also: What's new at your company? Where's the growth happening in your industry? How do you compare to your competitors? What do you see for your field in the future? What are the qualities you seek in a job candidate?

Network with other job seekers. Ask what kind of work they're seeking, which employers they've talked with already and what resources they might have to share. Be ready to share your information too. In fact, consider setting up coffee dates with anyone with whom you feel a connection. You need support as much as you need job leads.
