SERVICEOFFICER REPORT:

INTRODUCTION TO THE VETERANS' AID AND ATTENDANCE SPECIAL PENSION

The Veterans' Administration offers a Special Pension with Aid and Attendance (A&A) benefit that is largely unknown. This Special Pension allows for Veterans and surviving spouses who require the regular attendance of another person to assist in eating, bathing, dressing, undressing or taking care of the needs of nature to receive additional monetary benefits.

It also includes individuals who are blind or a patient in a nursing home because of mental or physical incapacity. Assisted care in an assisted living facility also qualifies.

This most important benefit is overlooked by many families with Veterans or surviving spouses who need additional monies to help care for ailing parents or loved ones. This is a "pension benefit" and is not dependent upon service-related injuries for compensation. Most Veterans who are in need of assistance qualify for this pension. Aid and Attendance can help pay for care in the home, nursing home or assisted living facility. A Veteran is eligible for up to \$1,470 per month, while a surviving spouse is eligible for up to \$945 per month. A couple is eligible for up to \$1,743 per month*.

Friday, January 18, 1991 was a big day at our Post. That is the day that the Florida Times Union came out with interviews of many of our Post members. The article was entitled "Veterans' Views of Desert Storm".

Here are a few excerpts:

"I thought it was great. All the nations are with us. If anything, the support will get better as a result of what happened." Ed Renckley, Korea and Vietnam, Navy

"I wish I could be over there, but I'm too damn old." A.H. McNabb, World War II, Korea and Vietnam, Navy

"I wish we could have held off a little longer, but since we're in there, let's get it over with as soon as possible. This is hard on everyone - the soldiers, parents, friends." Robby Robertson, World War II, Marines

"It's fantastic that they flew all those planes and only lost two. They did a tremendous job. I just hope it continues that way." Cy Tripp, World War II, Korea and Vietnam, Air Force

"I hated to see it happen, but glad to see it happen the way it did. Nobody wants to go to war, but sometimes you have to. That was the case here." Henry Morris, Vietnam, Navy

There were also comments from 6 other Legionnaires: Dennis Walker (Vietnam, Navy), Earl Pearson (World War II, Marines), Jack Lawley (World War II, Navy), Stan Jencks (World War II, Army), Fred Brown (World War II, Navy) and Bob Jennings (World War II, Army).

All 11 of these folks were celebrities for the day (especially Mr. McNabb). It was also great publicity for the greatest Legion Post that I know of!

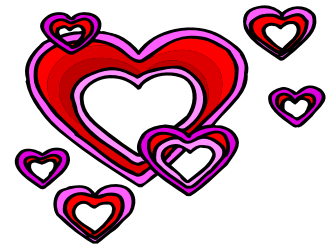

EMPLOYMENT OFFICER:

FLORIDA'S MINIMUM WAGE

Florida's minimum wage is \$6.67 per hour effective January 1, 2007 for all hours worked in Florida. This represents a 27¢ increase from the \$6.40 per hour minimum wage in 2006. Florida's minimum wage was created in a constitutional amendment approved by voters on November 2, 2004, and covers all employees in the state covered by the federal minimum wage.

Pursuant to the language of the state constitutional amendment, the Agency for Workforce Innovation is to perform an annual calculation to establish a new minimum wage each year. The constitution also requires the adjusted minimum wage to be published. The current minimum wage represents a 4.2% percent change in the federal consumer price index for urban wage earners and clerical workers in the South Region for the 12-month period prior to September 1, 2006. Florida's minimum wage is \$1.52 more than the current \$5.15 federal minimum wage.

Employers must pay their employees a wage not less than the amount of the hourly state minimum wage for all hours worked in Florida. The definitions of "employer," "employee," and "wage" for state purposes are the same as those established under the federal Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA).

For "tipped employees" meeting eligibility requirements for the tip credit under the FLSA, employers may count tips actually received as wages under the FLSA, but the employer must pay "tipped employees" a direct wage in an amount equal to the minimum wage of \$6.67 minus \$3.02 (which, as required by Florida's Constitution, is the 2003 tip credit existing under the FLSA), or a direct hourly wage of \$3.65 as of January 1, 2007.

Corporal Isaiah Calloway was killed while serving in Afghanistan his funeral was held on Veterans Day, 11 Nov 06. The radical group in Kansas made it known that they planned to come protest/disrupt the funeral. A call went out to the Patriot Guard. This is a group that strives to help maintain the dignity of a military funeral and show support for the family. Two members of Chapter 137 of the American Legion Riders felt honor bound to answer the call. About 30 to 40 bikes were expected.

On the morning of the 11th over 700 bikes and @ 20 cars loaded with people showed up. There were nearly 2 thousand people. They came from Tampa, Mississippi, and Georgia. None of these people had ever seen or heard of Isaiah Calloway until this sad event, but they chose to come and stand in the sun for Corporal Calloway. They were united by a common purpose. That purpose was to show honor to this young man and to offer support to family members.

When the time for the funeral party's arrival neared, supporters began to line both sides of the street. The family approached the church under an archway of flags that stretched for 3/4 of a city block. The same was true at the cemetery. The family was deeply touched.

You don't have to be a member of the Patriot Guard or a biker to participate. The only requirement is a heart felt belief in what the person died for. All of those living in freedom could never repay what one man died to help preserve.
