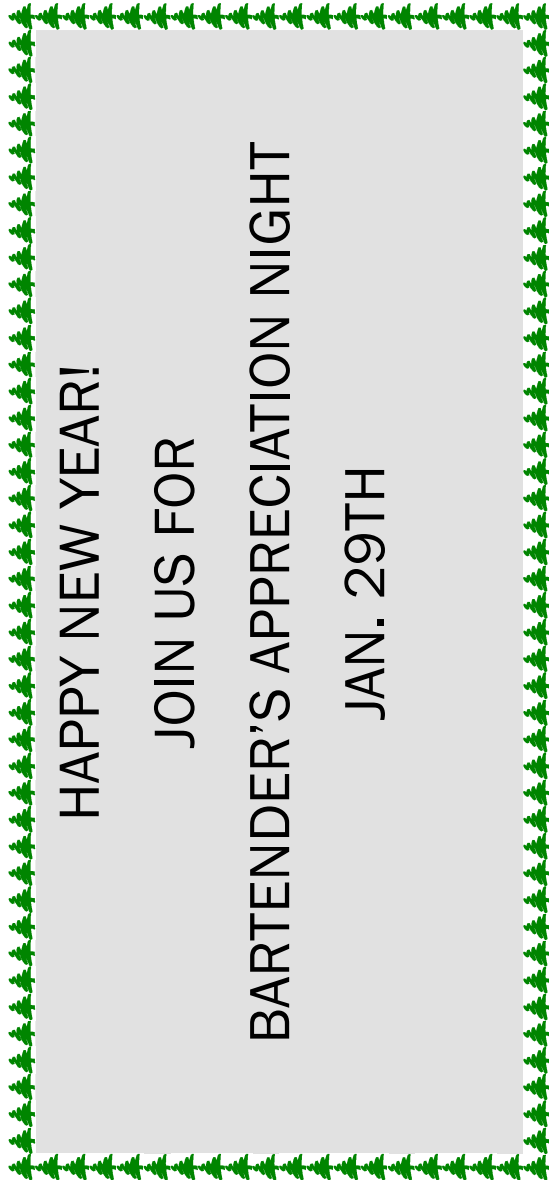

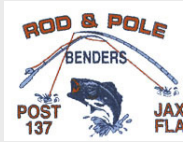

IMPORTANT

**"Proposed Revisions to Post 137 "
"House Rules and Regulations"**

As the Adjutant it is my duty to inform the membership of the following items to be voted on by the next Executive Committee and General Assembly meetings in January.

Section 4. No persons under 21 years old shall sit at the bar at any time, and all persons under 21 years of age, with the exception of active duty military, are required to leave Legion property at 2100 hours (9:00 PM). The only exceptions to the 2100 hour rule are preapproved special American Legion functions. **Keycards will only be issued to Post Members in good standing, who are at least 21 years old.** Active duty military shall have use of the full range of Post facilities provided they conduct themselves according to Post 137 By-Laws and Regulations. Persons less than 18 years of age may sit at the tables adjacent to the lounge windows, play the juke box or pool table only if accompanied by and supervised by an adult Post member.

Section 6. Rules shall be posted governing the

various games available in the Post Home. No gambling is permitted per Florida Statutes. Game rules shall be strictly enforced. Pool table will be closed during all meals and meetings held in the hall and special occasions. **Electronic gaming cards are only available for Post Members who meet the applicable state statues regarding electronic gaming. Post Members may allow their guests to use their gaming cards, provided their guests also meet the applicable state statues regarding electronic gaming.**
